Minutes of meeting on 8 December, at Ralston Community Centre

Action

Welcome from the Chair: Chair welcomed all to the meeting.

<u>Police Report:</u> PC Greer advised that in the last month there were 4 crime reports: 2 thefts from a motor vehicle (please be vigilant and lock vehicles, as these often increase at this time of year), 1 fraud (please remain vigilant and look after family and neighbours) 1 drug supply (not specifically related to the area, as it was a car passing through Ralston). Speeding on Glasgow Road remains an issue that the police continue to tackle.

Guest Speaker: St Mirren Lighting: Colin Hunter, Environmental Health Manager, Renfrewshire Council and Alasdair Morrison, Head of Economy and Development, Renfrewshire Council spoke about their role and the contact they have had with St Mirren over the years to resolve the lighting issue. The Council have written to St Mirren as landlord, instructing them to come up with a solution to the lighting issue by 1 January 2023. If a workable solution is not provided, St Mirren will be told that they cannot use their lights until the issue is resolved. If they don't comply, they could be taken to court or ultimately their lease could be withdrawn. Colin Hunter will keep us updated with any progress.

<u>Councillor's Reports:</u> Cllr Graham: Ralston Bowling Club: The club is struggling and is looking for new members. Would appreciate the community supporting this very worthwhile organisation. OneRen: All 3 Councillors met with the OneRen Chief Executive, Victoria Hollows, who has been advised by Cllr Lisa Marie Harkins not to meet with anyone regarding Ralston Sports Centre while the appeal is ongoing. However Victoria Hollows has agreed to meet the Councillors after the ILA decision on the appeal in January. Hawkhead cemetery: Cllr Graham has started volunteering to help clear some of the overgrown paths. Seeking to encourage Friends of Hawkhead Cemetery to join in, however they have declined so far. Glasgow Road/Hawkhead Junction: A resident suggested a box junction be installed, however as cars cannot wait inside a box junction it would delay traffic passing through it. A filter lane at this junction is currently being considered. Red Lines on Gartmore: This is still going through the consultative process. 20mph zones: Fergal highlighted the recent consultation, confirming that they would be mandatory rather that

advisory, therefore enforceable by the police. He also highlighted that a number of roads around the school weren't included in the consultation. Cllr Graham agreed to look into it. Alison would forward email. Cllr Clarke: Ralston Sports Centre Bins: Confirmed that these have now been emptied. Ralston Sports Centre carpark lights: Have raised with OneRen to resolve. Warm Connections: Applications for funding still open. Citizens Advice: Visiting schools in the area to advise people during the crisis.

Community Council Forum: The working group will now be in person in the Council HQ, rather than online, May or Alison will attend. Christmas Card: From Russell Findlay MSP. Newsletter: A resident emailed thanking us for keeping the community well informed of what's happening in the area. Another really liked the newsletter. Ralston in Bloom: Another resident emailed appreciating the planters. Heartstart training: Arranged for 29 January, 2-4pm at St Mark's church, teaching people about basic emergency life support. To be shared on Facebook & Website. Alison will forward details onto the Scouts
